**Quotation Marks (" ")** : Used to indicate direct speech, quotations, or titles of shorter works.

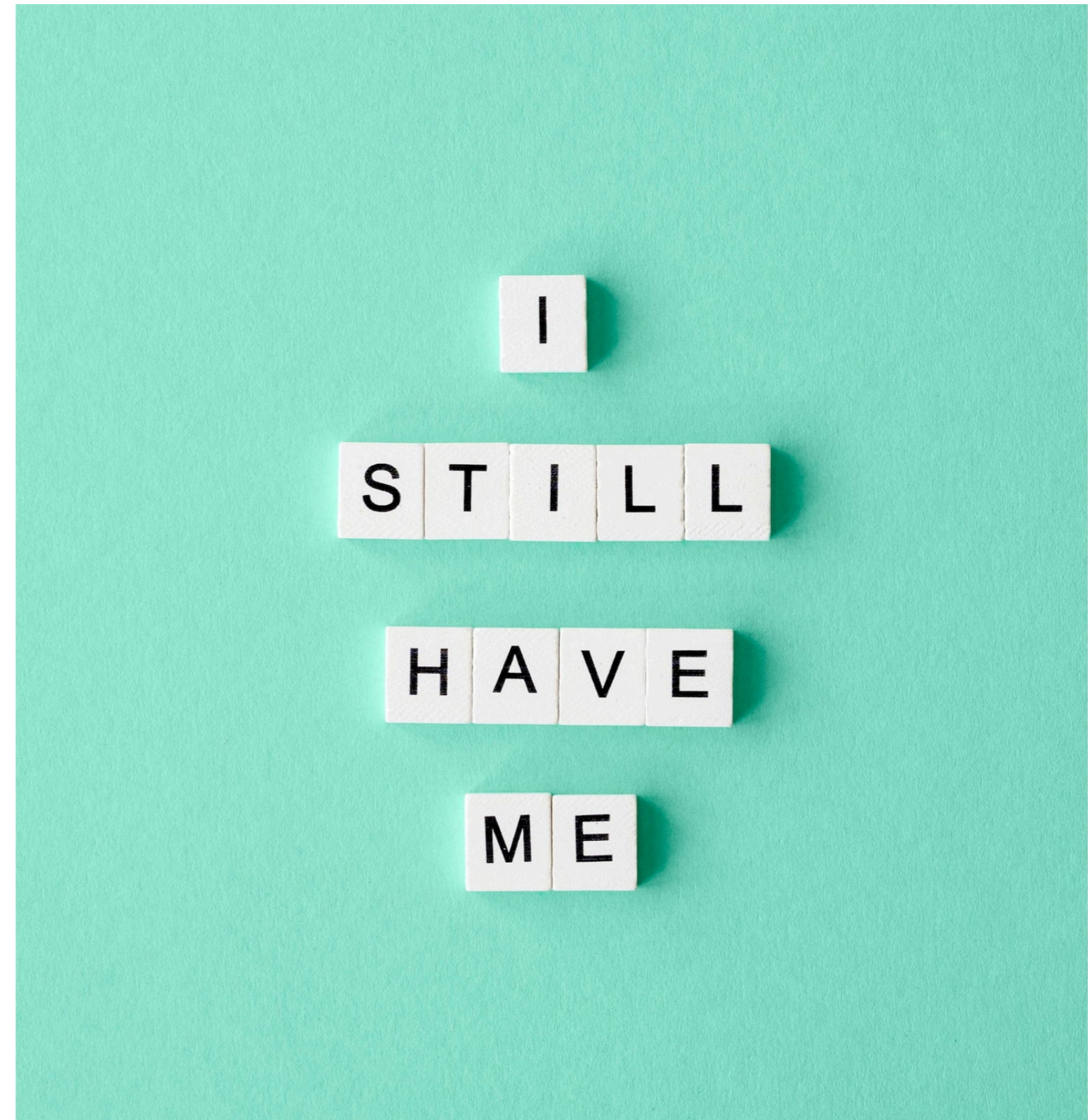
**Apostrophe (')** : Used to indicate possession or contraction.

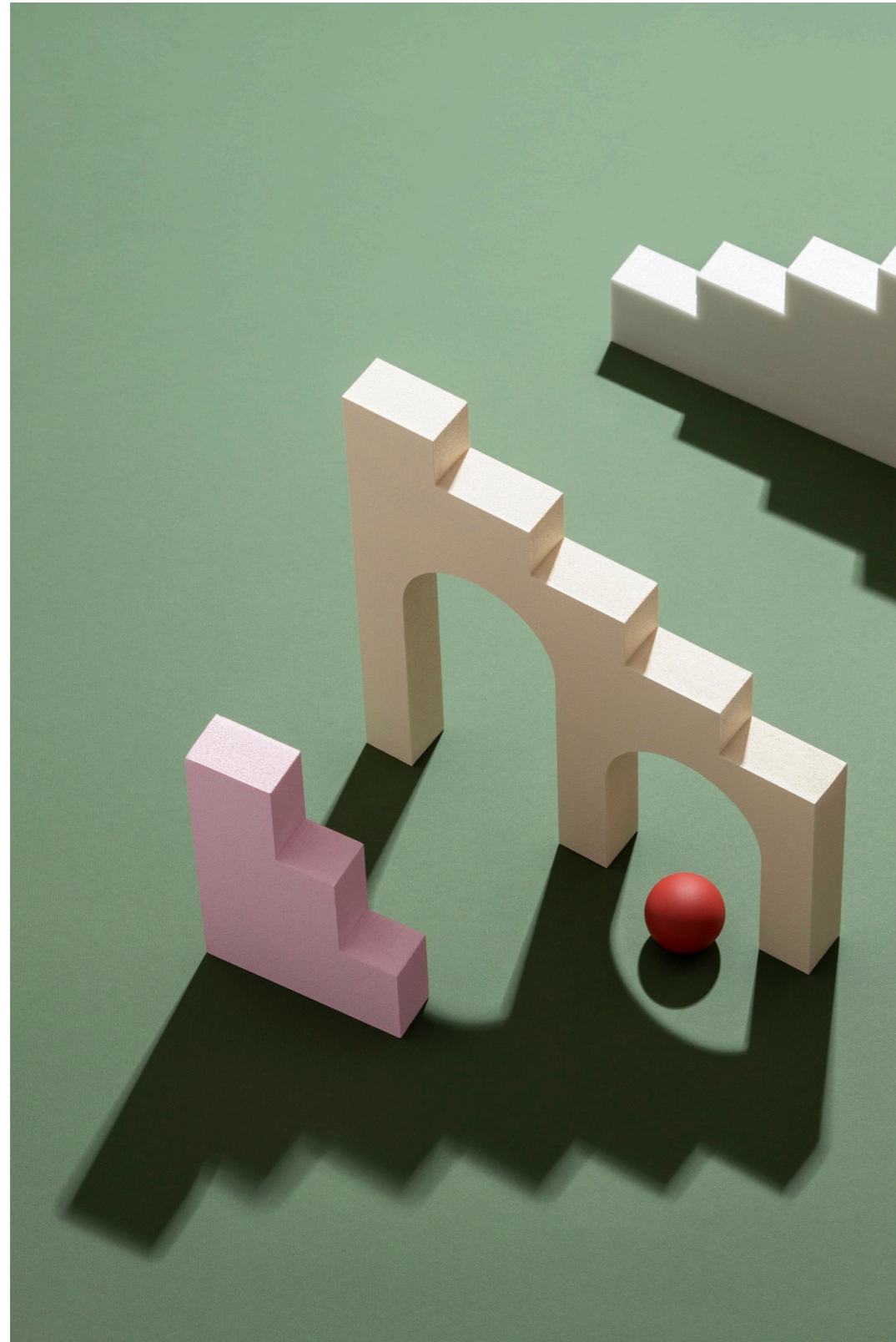
